Help is available to anyone who does not have an attorney.

SHS cannot help with:

- Family Court issues such as divorce, child custody, or support.
- Domestic Violence Restraining Orders.
- Elder Abuse Restraining Orders.
- Probate matters.
- Unlawful Detainer or Small Claims matters.
- Criminal cases.
- Complex civil litigation.
- Medical or legal malpractice.
- Any matter where you are represented by an attorney.
- Appeals
