

ORDER

**EXTENSION OF COURT ORDER – May 16, 2020 to June 12, 2020
and
IMPLEMENTATION OF RENEWED EMERGENCY RELIEF
(Cal. Gov. Code §68115)**

The court’s prior Temporary Court Closure Order issued March 19, 2020, and all subsequent amendments thereto, are hereby extended in full force and effect from May 16, 2020 to and including June 12, 2020.

The period May 16, 2020 to June 12, 2020, inclusive, remains a declared court holiday for all purposes except as specified in the court’s Temporary Court Closure Order issued March 19, 2020, and as to those additional court services and operations that have been expressly resumed by court order in all subsequent amendments thereto. All courthouses and courtrooms remain closed for judicial business, except as required to process and adjudicate those limited matters expressly excepted from the continuing court holiday and pursuant to the court’s published protocols consistent with the prevailing state and county health orders.

Further, pursuant to the authority provided under California Government Code Section

1 68115, the court hereby implements the renewed emergency relief granted in the May 14, 2020
2 order of Chief Justice Tani G. Cantil-Sakauye, Chair of the Judicial Council of California,

3 **IT IS ORDERED:**

4 1. Except as to filing types expressly excluded from the filing holiday by separate
5 court orders, the court declares that from May 16, 2020, to June 12, 2020, inclusive, is deemed a
6 holiday for purposes of computing the time for filing papers with the court under Code of Civil
7 Procedure sections 12 and 12a. The court makes this declaration because the emergency
8 conditions attendant to the Covid-19 pandemic shall continue to substantially interfere with the
9 public's ability to file papers in the court's facilities during that period. (Gov. Code, §
10 68115(a)(4));

11 2. The court extends the time period provided in section 1382 of the Penal Code for
12 the holding of a criminal trial by 30 days, applicable only to cases in which the initial statutory
13 deadline to conduct the trial would occur from June 16, 2020, to July 17, 2020, inclusive. (Gov.
14 Code, § 68115(a)(10)). This relief is in addition to the extensions already granted in the Judicial
15 Council's Statewide Emergency Orders;

16 3. The court extends the time period provided in section 334 of the Welfare and
17 Institutions Code within which a hearing on a juvenile dependency petition must be held by not
18 more than 15 days. This relief applies only to minors for whom the statutory deadline otherwise
19 would expire on from May 16, 2020 to June 12, 2020, inclusive. (Gov. Code, § 68115(a)(12));
20 and,

21 4. The court extends the time period provided in section 657 of the Welfare and
22 Institutions Code within which a hearing on a wardship petition for a minor charged with a felony
23 offense must be held by not more than 15 days. This relief applies only to minors for whom the
24 statutory deadline otherwise would expire from May 16, 2020 to June 12, 2020, inclusive. (Gov.
25 Code, § 68115(a)(12))

26 5. The court declares that from May 16, 2020 to June 12, 2020, inclusive, is deemed
27 a holiday/holidays for purposes of computing time under Code of Civil Procedure 1167 (five-day
28 period within which defendant must respond to a complaint in unlawful detainer action).

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**THIS ORDER IS EFFECTIVE IMMEDIATELY AND WILL REMAIN IN
EFFECT UNTIL JUNE 12, 2020. THIS ORDER MAY BE AMENDED AS
CIRCUMSTANCES REQUIRE.**
