

ORDER

**END OF CIVIL FILING HOLIDAY
RESUMPTION OF SPECIFIED CIVIL PROCEEDINGS**

On April 16, 2020, the Court issued an order extending the court closure from April 17, 2020 to May 15, 2020, and implementing renewed emergency relief granted by the Chief Justice Tani G. Cantil-Sakauye, as Chair of the Judicial Council of California. As part of that order, the Presiding Judge declared April 17, 2020 to May 15, 2020, inclusive, to be holidays for purposes of computing time for filing papers with the court under Code of Civil Procedure Sections 12 and 12(a).

The Presiding Judge has now determined that the court is able to resume limited specified civil proceedings in Civil Law and Motion, Civil Writs, and Complex Civil through the use of technology, remote appearances and special filing protocols. In order to resume those limited civil proceedings on the future starting dates set forth below, it is necessary to end the civil filing holiday earlier than previously declared.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

1. The Court's April 16, 2020 order, at paragraph 1, is amended to now provide as

1 follows: “April 17, 2020 to May 5, 2020, inclusive, are deemed holidays for purposes of
2 computing time for filing papers with the court under Code of Civil Procedure Sections 12 and
3 12(a).” The “holiday” period under Code of Civil Procedure Sections 12 and 12(a) previously
4 declared for May 6, 2020 to May 15, 2020, is rescinded relating to those civil cases that are or
5 will be handled at either the Gordon D. Schaber Courthouse, Department 59 or in the Law &
6 Motion Departments.

7 2. Civil Writ and Complex Civil judges, at their discretion, may reset previously
8 continued matters to be heard on assigned dates and times beginning May 26, 2020. These judges
9 may also set new Civil Writ and/or Complex Civil matters to be heard after May 26, 2020. Civil
10 Writ and Complex Civil matters shall be heard in a designated shared courtroom using only
11 remote appearances. Parties will receive notice of reset hearing dates and related information
12 pertaining to their video and telephonic remote appearance options. No in-person attendance will
13 be permitted.

14 3. Civil Law and Motion judges, at their discretion, may reset previously continued
15 matters to be heard on assigned dates and times beginning June 1, 2020. These judges may also
16 set new matters to be heard after June 1, 2020. Parties will receive notice of reset hearing dates
17 and related information pertaining to their video and telephonic remote appearance options. No
18 in-person attendance will be permitted.

19 4. For all new civil filings that require a hearing date, including new motions,
20 applications and petitions, parties must reserve a hearing date prior to filing. Parties are directed
21 to consult the related public notice for specific filings protocols.
