ORDER

END OF CRIMINAL FILING HOLIDAY

On April 16, 2020, the Court issued an order extending the court closure from April 17, 2020 to May 15, 2020, and implementing renewed emergency relief granted by the Chief Justice Tani G. Cantil-Sakauye, as Chair of the Judicial Council of California. As part of that order, the Presiding Judge declared April 17, 2020 to May 15, 2020, inclusive, to be holidays for purposes of computing time for filing papers with the court under Code of Civil Procedure Sections 12 and 12(a).

The Presiding Judge has now determined that the court is able to resume the receipt and processing of new criminal filings as of May 6, 2020, so it is necessary to end the criminal filing holiday earlier than previously declared.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

1. The Court's April 16, 2020 order, at paragraph 1, is amended to now provide as follows: "April 17, 2020 to May 5, 2020, inclusive, are deemed holidays for purposes of computing time for filing papers with the court under Code of Civil Procedure Sections 12 and 12(a)." The "holiday" period under Code of Civil Procedure Sections 12 and 12(a) previously

1 declared for May 6, 2020 to May 15, 2020, is rescinded as it relates to criminal filings.

2 2. For all new filings in criminal proceedings that require a hearing date, parties must
3 reserve a hearing date prior to filing. Parties are directed to consult the related public notice for
4 specific criminal filing protocols.
