



## Mission Statement

Our mission is to serve the community and its youth by encouraging positive citizenship, preventing delinquency, and advocating for the effectiveness of the Justice System.

Mandated by sections 225 through 231 of the California State Welfare and Institutions Code, the Commission consists of 15 members appointed by the residing judge of the Superior Court with the approval of the judge of the Juvenile Court

## Goals

The Commissions oversee the juvenile court system and inspect facilities to ensure they are in compliance with the law. In the area of delinquency prevention we would like to create an "Information Network" which would facilitate the sharing of information between the different county commissions and delinquency prevention programs statewide. We would like to become a leader in the community in delinquency prevention.

## Functions of the Commission

The Juvenile Justice Commission has the following legally mandated responsibilities:

- To inquire into the administration of the Juvenile Court law in Sacramento County.
- To annually inspect all publicly administered secure detention facilities and institutions used for minors under the age of 18 years.
- To inspect private facilities that receive children by Juvenile Court order.
- To submit a written report of its findings and recommendations to the Sacramento County Juvenile Court and to the Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation, Division of Juvenile Justice.
- To hold meetings as deemed necessary. (WIC Sections 229 and 229.5).
- Provide a written Annual Report of the activities of the various Commission committees to the Presiding Judge of the Juvenile Court, the State Corrections Standards Authority, the Board of Supervisors and to others as directed by the Commission.

## Scholarship Program

Beginning in 2006, the JJDPC Commissioners agreed to donate funds they received for their voluntarily participation at the monthly JJDPC meetings to support the JJDPC Education for Success Scholarship Program. Funds are continuously collected for the purpose of making up to three individual scholarship awards of \$1000 per year.

### Eligibility:

- Youth who are, or have been involved in the Sacramento County Juvenile Justice System;
- Demonstrates a willingness to work towards improving themselves
- Indicates a positive plan for their educational future;
- Has need for some degree of financial assistance.
