The recruitment will be used to establish a list of candidates for future vacancies. Court Commissioners may be assigned to hear cases in the following areas of law: criminal, civil, traffic, small claims, family, probate, guardianship, child support, and unlawful detainer.

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS

- Active member in good standing with the State Bar of California and admitted to practice law in California for at least ten (10) years, or on a finding of good cause by the Presiding Judge, for at least five (5) years; OR
- Currently serving as a subordinate judicial officer in a trial court as of January 1, 2003.

DESIRABLE QUALIFICATIONS

The successful candidate will need to possess a judicial temperament that is patient, dignified and courteous with all court users and court personnel and must be able to effectively and efficiently perform duties without bias or prejudice. Although not required, general criminal and probate experience is a desirable. Those candidates with such experience are encouraged to apply.

COMPENSATION

The Court offers an attractive compensation plan of \$196,497.86 annually, with a 3.35% subordinate judicial officer differential. In addition, benefits are provided which include: vacation and sick leave, holidays and bereavement leave, medical, dental, and vision benefits, life and long-term disability insurance and deferred compensation. Retirement is through the Sacramento County Employee's Retirement System (SCERS) with reciprocity with PERS and other 1937 Act retirement plans.

HOW TO APPLY

- Applications will be accepted on a continuous basis with various cutoff dates and must be submitted online. Applicants are responsible for submitting a complete application, including answers to supplemental questions. Incomplete submissions will not be accepted.
- Application submissions will be evaluated to select the best-qualified candidates to continue in the selection process as vacancies occur.
- The best-qualified candidates may be invited to one or more panel interview(s). The interview(s) may consist of written and/or oral questions.
